MUNICIPAL PROJECT APPROVAL COMMITTEE (MPAC) MEETING

The MPAC Meeting in Lalitpur Metropolitan City was a success! We **received preapproval for the "Children Holistic Development 2024-2026" project.** Additionally, we've received **pre-approvals from various districts**, including Kathmandu, Bhaktapur, Lalitpur, Dhading, and Makawanpur. This allows us **to conduct scholarships, school support, TOT programs, women literacy program, child participation programs,** awareness campaigns, and coordination and collaboration programs with local governments from 2024 to 2026.

ECD PROGRAM HANDOVER

On May 6th, we brought joy to the kids of the **Early Childhood Development (ECD) program at Balpremi School in Madhyapur Thimi** by delivering vibrant **playing and learning materials,** along with brand-**new furniture.** The program was conducted in the presence of ward president, school principal, teacher, OLOW staff, board member and school management committee. These contributions aim to ignite young minds, boost cognitive skills, and foster cooperation and physical activity. We're not just furnishing a classroom; we're nurturing a dynamic, interactive learning environment that sets the foundation for lifelong learning.



WORLD DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE

As part of the international program against drug abuse and illicit trafficking from June 20th-26th, **OLOW participated in a rally** organized by Ward 14 offices and the community police Tikhedewal Lalitpur. We also held a **public awareness program for 72 students in classes 9 and 10** of Saraswoti School to strengthen action and cooperation in achieving a world free of drug abuse.



AWARENESS PROGRAM ON CYBER CRIME

We organized an impactful **awareness session** for enthusiastic **9 and 10 grade students and 11 and 12 students** at Shree Sharmik School, Chyasal Lalitpur on 5th July 2024 and 10th July respectively. Through **interactive discussions and informative videos**, students delved into critical topics such as cyber crime, drug abuse, child marriage, and trafficking. These awareness programs are vital in creating a well-informed community ready to tackle these pressing issues head-on.



KHUSI CHILD CLUB MEETING

On the 23rd of May 2024, the Khusi Child Club, a dedicated **group of children from the Family Reintegration Project,** had an impactful **meeting** at the OLOW Premises. The meeting's main purpose was to **discuss important updates on their families and education**. It was a day filled with meaningful conversations, shared experiences, and a collective vision for a brighter future.

MONITORING AND EVALUATION: ENSURING QUALITY AND IMPACT

This year, comprehensive monitoring and evaluation were conducted for the Nepali fiscal year 2079-2080. Officials from the Social Welfare Council (SWC) and External team Leader assessed our efforts at various schools, including Adarsha, Saraswoti, Vidya Mandir, and UCEF Nepal as well as interaction was conducted with Child Right Committee ward-14 of Lalitpur, President of Ward-04 Thimi, School Management committee of Ruby Valley, children and youth as well as Principals of various school. The monitoring process involved a thorough **review of our programs, focusing on their implementation, effectiveness, and adherence to set goals.** They also **evaluated our annual progress report**, providing valuable insights and feedback to ensure that our initiatives continue to create meaningful and lasting impact in the communities we serve. This evaluation process is crucial in maintaining transparency, accountability, and the ongoing success of our work.





CHILD PROFILE SURVEY

In collaboration with the Child Rights Committee of Ward 14, Lalitpur Metropolitan City, OneLoveOneWorld conducted a comprehensive **child profile survey**. The survey was carried out from 23rd April to 18th June, 2024 with a team of 8 dedicated enumerators who visited a total of **2,863 households** to collect crucial data on school attendance, dropout rates, and child rights awareness, ensuring we understand and address the needs of children in the community in an effective manner.

VOCATIONAL TRAINING: EMPOWERING FUTURE CAREERS

Rupa and Manisha, our scholarship students, have taken a significant step towards their future by enrolling in vocational training. Recognizing the importance of acquiring practical skills, both have opted for a **six-month advanced beautician course.** This training will equip them with the expertise needed to pursue successful careers in the beauty industry, providing them with the tools to achieve financial independence. In addition, Seema Kumari, a dedicated student from our Family Reintegration Project, has embarked on a bakery training program at Asia Women Bridge Nepal. This program will not only teach her the art of baking but also open doors to entrepreneurial opportunities, allowing her to build a sustainable livelihood.





NEW ENROLLMENT AND FAMILY VISITS: EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES

At OneLoveOneWorld, we are committed to transforming lives through education. This year, we have welcomed **28 new students** from Balpremi, Adarsha, Saraswoti, Vidya Mandir, Sharmik, and Mahalaxmi schools. During family visits in Thimi, we assessed the critical financial and family situations of potential students, leading to these new enrollments. With this expansion, **our total number of students has increased from 64 to 98**.Out of 98, 5 are in the process of graduation and one has been dropped out. We are also excited to include Mahalaxmi School in our program this year. Your support is crucial to providing these students with the educational materials and opportunities they need.
